### **1. INTRODUCTION**

As the Flagship 8x8 HDBaseT<sup>™</sup> Matrix, the PU-8H8HBTE solution offers complete HDBaseT<sup>™</sup> 5-Play<sup>™</sup> convergence. Installers can switch and distribute up to 8 HDMI sources, LAN (Local Area Network), 2-Way IR, and PoC (Power over Cable) to lengths of up to 100m using CAT5e/6/7 cable infrastructure. Control of the matrix is via IP control, RS-232, IR remote, or manual selection buttons. This single box solution will enable an installer to confidently integrate an eight zone multi-room AV system. The PU-8H8HBTE is designed to be used with the PU-507-RX Receiver which can utilise PoC capabilities of the matrix.

Use the LAN serving capabilities of the matrix to add internet connectivity to every zone. In addition, this matrix also features IR, RS232. IP(telnet) and web GUI control allowing users to access and control the matrix remotely and also allow additional options for integration of third-party control systems. CYP provide control drivers for control systems such as Control 4, RTI, Crestron, AMX, Control FX, and RTI. These are available at no extra cost.

# **4. SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS**

- HDMI equipped source devices, connect with HDMI cables or DVI equipped source, connect with DVI to HDMI cables
- HDMI equipped displays (TVs or monitors) or HDMI equipped AV receivers, connect with HDMI cables
- Industry standard CAT5e/6/7 cables
- HDBaseT<sup>™</sup> Receivers (i.e. PU-506RX, PU-507RX or PU-1109RX)


- 1. The PoC function is designed for powering compatible receiver units only—non-PoC receivers will need their own power supply. Receivers of another brand may not be compatible.
- 2. Do not connect the LAN/CONTROL port to CAT outputs of this device.

# 6. OPERATION CONTROLS AND FUNCTIONS

#### **6.1 Front Panel**



**LCM :** Displays the setting information of each input and output setting.

POWER: Press this button to power the device on/off. The LED will illuminate green when the power is on, red when it is in 'Standby' mode.

**EXAMPLE 3 LOCK:** Press this button to lock all the buttons on the panel; press again to unlock. The LED will illuminate green when locked.

IR: IR Receiver window (accepts the remote control signal of this device only).

5 MENU: Press this button to access the LCM menu system, from here EDID settings can be managed and IP system settings are displayed.

6 1~8/A~H and OUT/IN: Press the OUT or IN button to select the output or input mode and then press the required number button to make the selection accordingly.

For example, if outputs A~D need to be set to input 1 and outputs E~H need to be set to input 2, then the following sequence of button presses need to be performed:

Press:  $OUT \rightarrow A \rightarrow B \rightarrow C \rightarrow D \rightarrow IN \rightarrow 1 \rightarrow MENU$ , and then press:  $OUT \rightarrow E \rightarrow F \rightarrow G \rightarrow H \rightarrow IN \rightarrow 2 \rightarrow MENU$ .

Note: If the MENU button is not pressed the selection will not be changed.





# 6.2 Rear Panel

 LAN: This port is the link for Telnet and Web GUI controls, connect to an active Ethernet link with an RJ45 terminated cable (for further details, please refer to sections 6.8 and 6.9).

# Warning: Please do not connect this port directly to the PC/Laptop as the Telnet function will not work

When the Matrix or any compatible LAN equipped receivers are connected to a network, this allows the network access (including internet access if available) to be shared between the Matrix and all connected receivers. Connect any Ethernet equipped device e.g. a Smart TV or games console to the LAN port of a receiver for that device to share the network/internet access.

- **RS-232:** Connect to a PC or control system with D-Sub 9-pin cable for the transmission of RS-232 commands.
- 3 ALL IR OUT: Connect to the IR blaster for IR signal transmission of the source or display equipment. Place the IR blaster in direct line-of-sight of the equipment to be controlled.
- **4** ALL IR IN: Connect to the IR extender for IR signal reception of the remote control of this device or the source and display equipment. Ensure that remote being used is within the direct line-of-sight of the IR extender.
- **5 SERVICE:** Manufacturer use only.
- **IR OUT A~H:** Connect to the IR blasters for IR signal transmission. Place the IR blaster in direct line-of-sight of the equipment to be controlled.
- CAT5e/6/7 OUT A~H: Connect these CAT outputs to the CAT input port of the receiver units with a single CAT5e/6/7 cable for HDMI Audio/Video, LAN and IR control signal transmission.
- B HDMI IN 1~8: Connect to the HDMI input source devices such as a DVD player or a Set-top Box with HDMI cable or DVI to HDMI cable.
- IR IN 1~8: Connect to the IR extenders for IR signal reception. Ensure that the remote being used is within the direct line-of-sight of the IR extender.




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- **DC 24V MAIN POWER:** Plug the 24 V DC power supply into the unit and connect the adaptor to an AC outlet.
- **PoC 24V:** Plug the 24 V PoC power supply into the unit and connect the adaptor to an AC outlet. This unit will mainly power PoC (Power over Ethernet) capaable receiver units.


Warning: Please do not connect the CAT5e/6/7 cable into the receiver's LAN port.

Fan Ventilator: These are air ventilation areas, DO NOT block these areas or cover it with any object. Please allow adequate space around the unit for air circulation.



#### **6.8 Telnet Control**

Before attempting to use the telnet control, please ensure that both the Matrix (via the 'LAN /CONTROL' port) and the PC/Laptop are connected to active networks.


Note: Please do not connect both the Matrix and the PC/Laptop with a single CAT5e/6 cable as it will not access the telnet function.

To access the telnet control in Windows 7, click on the 'Start' menu and type "cmd" in the Search field then press enter.

Under Windows XP go to the 'Start' menu and click on "Run", type "cmd" with then press enter.

Under Mac OS X, go to Go $\rightarrow$ Applications $\rightarrow$ Utilities $\rightarrow$ Terminal








Once in the command line interface (CLI) type "telnet", a space, then the IP address of the unit you wish to control, a space and "23", then hit enter.

Note: The IP address of the Matrix can be displayed on the device's LCM monitor by pressing the Menu button twice.



This will bring us into the device which we wish to control. Type "HELP" to list the available commands.

Type "IPCONFIG" To show all IP configurations. To reset the IP, type "RSTIP" and to use a set static IP, type "SETIP" (For a full list of commands, see Section 6.7).

Note: Any commands will not be executed unless followed by a carriage return. Commands are not case-sensitive. If the IP is changed then the IP Address required for Telnet access will also change accordingly.






#### 6.9 Web GUI Control

On a PC/Laptop that is connected to an active network, open a web browser and type the Matrix's IP address on the web address entry bar. The browser will display the device's status, control and User setting pages.

Click on the 'Control' tab to control power, input/output ports, EDID and reset mode.








